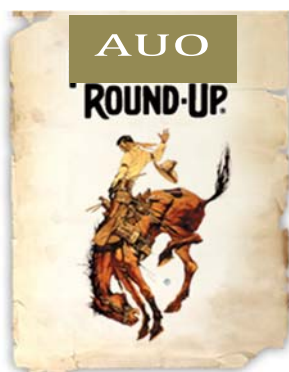

## Accreditation Self-Evaluation Report *ALMOST* Ready for Prime Time

In 2013-2014, The Accreditation Oversight Committee (AOC) began collecting information for the first draft of the Self Evaluation Report (SER). SCC Standing Committees and working groups submitted information and evidence for the SER to AOC and the AOC Co-Chairs reviewed the information over the summer. In fall semester, the SCC Standing Committees and working groups review the info and tried to fill in any gaps noticed by the AOC C-Chairs, and will turn those in to AOC this month. The SER Writing Team will begin drafting the SER based on info from the SCC Standing Committees and working groups, and the the first full draft of the SER will be made available to the campus community in early February. In February and March accreditation workshops and town hall style meetings will be held. The AOC encourages and welcomes your participation in this process.

### Your Integrated Planning Moment of ZEN

#### What's the Difference between Budget Development and Prioritization?

Part of the annual budget development process is a secondary process known as "Prioritization." Prioritization is intended to establish funding priorities among district-wide resource needs through a shared planning process. For budget needs that cannot be addressed through the annual budget development process, the college district's shared planning and decision-making body, the Shared Consultation Council (SCC), collaboratively reviews these resource requests and prioritizes them based on the college mission, the justifications found in program review, and our strategic planning priorities. In the hopes they can be addressed through other funding sources. In the spring, during the development of the next fiscal year's budget, SCC creates a master list of funding priorities in four major categories:

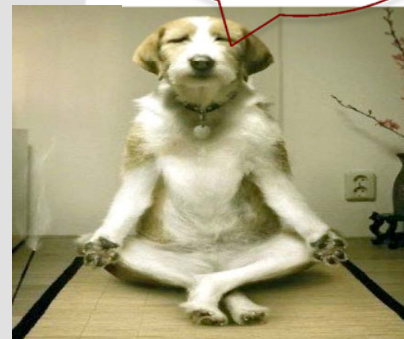
- Major Equipment
- Facilities
- New Technology Requests
- Overarching Needs (items that don't fit any other category)

Other categories appear in program review to inform budget development but are not part of prioritization. These categories are used by budget managers to make adjustments to their next fiscal year's budgets, if possible, in line with their unit's goals. These program review categories are **Human Resources**, **Minor Equipment**, and **Replacement Technology**



"Prioritization" is another way SWC integrates resource allocation with program review and institutional planning and supports on our Planning, Implementation, Evaluation (P.I.E.) model.
