Eligibility Requirements:

- Must enroll in a CWEE course (290) within the first three weeks of the semester (first week for Summer)
- Must have declared a major and perform internship/work experience hours in an area directly related to major.

Student Responsibilities:

- Fill out the CWEE Agreement form and secure all required signatures (Instructor, Company/Agency Supervisor, Student)
- Communicate with instructor to identify learning objectives, internship needs, and/or placement.
- Secure a paid or unpaid internship on or before the scheduled drop deadline
- Complete the minimum hours required in order to receive a passing grade.
- Notify instructor if they would like a reduction in units (during refund period) as all students are automatically enrolled with 4 units.

Required Documentation:

1. Cooperative Work Experience Education (CWEE) – Agreement form (white)
2. CWEE Information and Visitation Card (Blue)
3. CWEE Time Card (pink)

- Must have all forms completed and signed.
- Failure to complete forms will result in an incomplete grade.
- Before submitting documents, print a copy for your records.
- Return all forms to instructor.

Students may earn up to (4) units per semester/session and a maximum of sixteen CWEE units while attending SWC. The minimum hours must be completed during the semester or students will not earn a passing grade.

Paid work (75 hours/unit)	Unpaid Work (60 hours/unit)
75 hours = 1 unit	60 hours = 1 unit
150 hours = 2 units	120 hours = 2 units
225 hours = 3 units	180 hours = 3 units
300 hours = 4 units	240 hours = 4 units
