The WorkPlace Ca receives funding from the Social Security Administration for the purpose of finding employment for SSI and SSDI recipients. The District has students who receive such funding and are enrolled in the Disability Support Services program. The WorkPlace Ca, as an independent contractor, will provide staffing while the District provides office space. There is no cost to the District. Program participants will be provided with extensive one-on-one job search assistance, which will enable them to meet their employment needs.

The 2007-2008 Memorandum of Understanding is an ongoing agreement with the Department of the Navy Human Resources Service Center, Southwest Region, in the paid employment of Cooperative Work Experience students. OVERVIEW

AmeriCorps members serving in the ELSRAP program will increase school readiness levels amongst pre-schoolers entering kindergarten, as well as increase their parent/family knowledge in school readiness to help better prepare their children for the transition from pre-school to kindergarten. Members will also increase the resource base and parent involvement at pre-schools and neighborhood family readiness centers, as well as recruit long-term volunteers to provide school readiness services to these sites to help sustain such programs. These outcomes will be measured through service activity participation and data collection utilizing access databases, the pre-service readiness survey, the CORE plan and the Behavior Assessment Gauge and test. The release of grant contracts/agreements and/or corresponding changes in grant performance periods are frequently subject to significant delay at the discretion of the funding source. Courses in basic laboratory skills, and in introduction to biomedical research, offered on these campuses prepares Bridges students for the initial intensive mini-internships at San Diego University.
