#### **OVERVIEW**

Group

Pursuant to Education Code Section 41010-41023, "each fiscal year, each county superintendent of schools shall provide for an audit of all funds under his or her jurisdiction and control and the governing board of each local educational agency shall either provide for an audit of the books and accounts of the local educational agency."

The District's financial audits were conducted by Messner and Hadley, LLP, Certified Public Accountants, in accordance with auditing standards. It is their opinion that the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Southwestern Community College District, as of June 30, 2006 and the respective changes in net assets and cash flows, for the fiscal year then ended in conformity with accounting principles.

The results of the audit disclosed no instances of non-compliance that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards. Messner and Hadley, LLP noted no matters involving the internal controls over financial reporting and its operation that they consider to be material weaknesses. Messner and Hadley, LLP noted three non-material matters involving the internal control over financial reporting as described in the audit.

All recommendations from previous years have been implemented and noted in the audit.

#### **OVERVIEW**

Child development students are required to complete a supervised field experience class at agencies that provide services related to their area of specialty in the major.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Authorize Agreement No. A2034.07 with Blackboard, Inc., for Online Learning System Managed Contact Center, for the period April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008, inclusive, for a cost not to exceed \$38,300 annually.

#### **OVERVIEW**

Purchase of this service will provide students and faculty, 24/7/365 days per year help desk, with live telephone support, live chat support, a support portal and knowledge base, enterprise reporting and satisfaction tracking, and account management. The college will be provided with an account manager who is responsible for implementation, operations, monthly reporting, and ensuring that all facets of the support infrastructure meet or exceed stated service levels.

This agreement will have no impact on the contract classified staff located in the Online Learning Center. Funds will be reallocated from the classified hourly budget, resulting in a net savings of approximately \$6,000.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Authorize Agreement No. A2026.07 with Ninyo & Moore for construction and materials testing services for the 800/850 music buildings remodel and the fire life safety/perimeter road project, for the period March 15, 2007 through July 31, 2008, inclusive, for a cost not to exceed \$125,000.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The Division of the State Architect (DSA) requires inspection of materials and testing of products installed in community college facilities. These services are required throughout the term of the project and reports are forwarded to DSA for review and approval. The District received eight (8) proposals and after a thorough review Ninyo & Moore has provided the most comprehensive proposal meeting the requirements of the Request for Proposal. This is a Proposition AA and State Construction project.

#### 12B2. AGREEMENT WITH KEENAN & ASSOCIATES

#### RECOMMENDATION

Authorize Agreement No. A2027.07 with Keenan & Associates to provide a web-based application named BenefitBridge for employee benefit program, for the period August 1, 2007 through July 31, 2010, inclusive, at no cost to the district.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The District provides for health and welfare benefits for retired and active employees. Currently, all benefit selections and review are done manually. This agreement will provide for a web-based application named BenefitBridge to be developed by Keenan & Associates which provides services for their client's employees and employee dependents to review available benefits and control various aspects of employee programs offered by the District. This agreement can be cancelled with a thirty (30) day prior written notice.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Authorize Agreement No. A2028.07 with LPA, Inc. for architectural services for the chemistry storeroom remodel for the period March 15 through September 20, 2007, inclusive, for a cost not to exceed \$50,000 billed on an hourly basis.

#### **OVERVIEW**

During the annual fire inspection in fall of 2006, the Chula Vista Fire Department notified the District that the chemistry storeroom where chemicals are stored did not meet current fire codes. The District is required to remodel the storeroom to install exhaust fans for ventilation and materials on the walls to make the room more fire resistant. This modification requires the plans be completed by a licensed architect and the services will be performed on an hourly basis because of the size and complexity of this project. The District selected the architectural firm, LPA, Inc., because of their experience with previous projects in our District. This contract was not bid because it was below the bid threshold.
