After discussion, the Board determined the following:

- Prior to commencing interviews, in fairness to all candidates, the Board will request that candidates wait in Room L246 until they are called to be interviewed.
- After being interviewed, candidates are welcome to join the audience for the remainder of the meeting.
- Candidates will have 30 seconds for opening remarks.
- The Board will ask approximately three (3) core questions for all interviews.
- Each Board Member will have three (3) minutes to ask additional questions.
- The order in which Board Members will ask questions will vary.
- Constituent Leaders will have three (3) minutes to ask questions.
- In an effort to maintain consistency and in consideration of time constraints, the Board will not accept additional materials or letters of reference/recommendation.
