OVERVIEW

The February 2008 Curriculum Summary Report is a compilation of the new and revised curriculum proposed by faculty and submitted to the Curriculum Committee December 6 through December 13, 2007. Faculty submit proposals for new and/or revised curriculum to the Curriculum Committee. The Curriculum Committee reviews and scrutinizes curriculum for academic rigor, transferability and/or occupational competencies, student benefit, and institutional fit, as stated in Title 5 and the State Chancellor's Curriculum Handbook. Once these and other considerations are met, the Curriculum Summary Report is forwarded to the Superintendent/President and Governing Board for review and approval before being sent to the State Chancellor's Office.

The Southwestern College Curriculum Committee has reviewed and approved 1 course modification and 2 program modifications.

9H. <u>APPROVE NONRESIDENT PER UNIT TUITION FEE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2008-2009</u> (Beasley/Chopra)

RECOMMENDATION

Recommend establishment of the Nonresident Per Unit Tuition Fee for FY 2008-2009 at \$181 per unit, effective with the FY 2008-2009 summer session, in accordance with Education Code Section 76140. This rate is the statewide average cost.

OVERVIEW

Education Code Section (ECS) 76140 requires the Governing Board to establish the Nonresident Per Unit Tuition Fee for the succeeding fiscal year.

The district has several options: a) to use the statewide computation of \$181, b) the district computation of \$188, or charge a different amount, not to exceed the highest amount charged by a contiguous district. In addition to the nonresident tuition, foreign students who are not residents of California are required to pay the California registration fee.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

This is an income source to the general fund.

OVERVIEW

This project will improve the educational quality of two-year college (2YC) chemistry education by increasing the connection of the nation's 2YC chemistry faculty to the national community of chemical educators, particularly those who develop and lead efforts to improve the methods used in foundational chemistry courses. Three symposia will be hosted featuring NSF Catalyzed Innovations in the Two-Year College Chemistry Curriculum at three National Meetings of the American Chemical Society (ACS) in 2009 and 2010 and two participatory workshops at the Biennial Conference in Chemical Education Meetings in the summers of 2008 and 2010.

Upon its conclusion, this project is expected to have aided the dissemination of NSF projects, raised the awareness of NSF funding opportunities, increased the number of proposals submitted by 2YC's or having co-Principal Investigators (PIs) from 2YC's, catalyzed the formation of a scholarly community of two-year college chemists and created collaborations and partnerships among two and four-year chemistry faculty.
