#### **Article V:**

 Effective for the 2004-05 academic year, there shall be a moratorium on sabbatical leaves.

#### **Article VII:**

- Effective July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004, 2% of the gross salary in each monthly pay
  warrant for full-time and part-time faculty members shall be deducted and donated to the
  District as a charitable contribution as defined by the Internal Revenue Service.
- An early retirement incentive plan is offered to eligible faculty members who retire effective December 20, 2003, providing 5% of final contract salary per year for life or comparable value alternatives.

Due to the District's severe budget shortfall for the coming year, the California School Employees' Association (CSEA) has agreed to revisions to the 2002-04 CSEA Contract, summarized as follows:

#### **Article VII:**

- Effective July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004, 2% of the gross salary in each monthly pay warrant for full-time, 12-month Classified Bargaining Unit members shall be deducted and donated to the District as a charitable contribution as defined by the Internal Revenue Service.
- The 2% reduction shall be taken in the form of 42 <u>unpaid</u> hours absence for each 12-month, 100% service Classified Bargaining Unit Member.
- Those Classified Bargaining Unit employees who are assigned to less than a 12-month, 100% contract shall take an equivalent pro-rata number of unpaid hours of absence.

#### **Article XXII:**

 <u>Effective December 31, 2003</u>, an early retirement incentive plan goes into effect for eligible Classified Bargaining Unit members, providing 3% of final contract salary per year for life or comparable value alternatives.
