ADDITIONAL GRADUATION AND PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

UNIT AND SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENT

Students must satisfactorily complete the following in order to meet associate degree requirements:

- A minimum of 60 units of degree level coursework.
- Satisfy all graduation requirements.
- Maintain a minimum 2.00 or higher grade point average for all Southwestern College general education coursework.
- All courses required for the major or area of emphasis must be completed with a "C" or better in each course.

COMPUTER LITERACY REQUIREMENT

The Computer Literacy requirement can be satisfied by completion of one course, with a minimum grade of "C" or better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit selected from the following:

NOTE: Students who have a background in computers may substitute a more advanced computer course or may have the requirement waived by verified work experience in the computer field. The student must submit a Student Petition with the Admissions Center to be considered for a substitution or waiver. For (ADN) nursing majors the computer literacy requirement is met by completion of courses for the major.

HEALTH EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

The Health Education requirement can be satisfied in one of the following ways:

- Completion of Health 101, 116 or 204 with a minimum grade of "C" or better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit.
- Obtaining a satisfactory score on the health inventory test.
- Petitioning for military credit and providing the DD-214 or DD-295 form. (*Certain restrictions apply. See SWC Policy 6039 for details.*)
- Completion of courses for Nursing (VN and ADN) and Dental Hygiene majors.

NOTE: Students are not eligible to take the *Health Inventory* test after receiving an unsatisfactory grade in *Health 101*.

EXERCISE SCIENCE REQUIREMENT

Students must satisfactorily complete two classes with a "C" or better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit in exercise science, dance, or one of each. A student is exempt from this requirement under any of the following circumstances:

- The student presents a physician's statement detailing a physical disability that would prevent them from participating in an adaptive exercise science activity class.
- The student provides verification of graduation from a two-year or four-year college or university.
- The student provides a military form (DD-214 or DD-295) showing at least one year of active duty (The College will grant two units of credit for exercise science).
- The student has taken the majority of classes as an evening student at Southwestern College (online classes are considered evening courses).
- The student has been accepted and has enrolled with the ADN (Associate Degree Nursing Program).

PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

Writing Proficiency Requirement

The English Writing Proficiency requirement can be satisfied by completion of one course, with a minimum grade of "C" or better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit in the following course:

ENGL 115	Reading and Composition: Exposition and Argumentation
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NOTE: The above course will also satisfy the General Education requirements for the following:

- Southwestern College - Area A: Written Communication.
- The California State University General Education Breadth Requirements – Area A2: Written Communication.
- The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) – 1A: English Composition.

Reading Proficiency Requirement

Reading proficiency can be satisfied in one of the following ways:

- Completion of Reading 158 or ENGL 115 with a minimum grade of "C" or better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit. Satisfactory score on the Southwestern College Reading Assessment examination.

Mathematics Proficiency Requirement

Mathematics proficiency can be satisfied in one of the following ways:

- Completion of MATH 60 (Intermediate Algebra I) or a higher numbered math course with a minimum grade of "C" or better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit.

- better or "P" pass-no pass formerly "Cr/NC" Credit/No Credit.
- Mathematics assessment results that indicate eligibility for MATH 70 (Intermediate Algebra II) or a higher numbered math course.

Students are encouraged to satisfy the mathematics proficiency through coursework and to pursue mathematics education beyond the minimum proficiency level required for the associate degree. Transfer students should be aware that the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC) entry level math examinations require proficiency above the level of Intermediate Algebra (MATH 60, 65 or 70).

The Southwestern College Mathematics Assessment may be taken throughout the year. It is advised that students take the test(s) as soon as possible before or following enrollment. Educational review can be arranged for students who are deficient in mathematics. However, it is the responsibility of each student to arrange to take the test(s), review his/her test result(s) and meet with a counselor. Review material will be available upon request.

COMPUTER LITERACY, HEALTH EDUCATION, PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT EXEMPTIONS

Students who have received a college degree from an accredited U.S. institution are not required to satisfy computer literacy, health education, physical education and proficiency requirements (English Writing, Reading and Mathematics) for the Southwestern College associate degree. All transcripts from other colleges must be on file. Petitions for substitution or waiver must be completed and submitted to the Admissions Office for consideration.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT

Students must satisfactorily complete the following in order to meet associate degree requirements:

- A minimum of 12 units used to satisfy degree requirements at Southwestern College.
