- Basic skills instruction, seminars, and tutorial assistance;
- · Counseling and retention services;
- Transfer services;
- Direct aid:
- Establishment of objectives to achieve the goals in implementing extended opportunity programs and services;
- Review and evaluation of the programs and services and submission of related reports.

In addition, all students participating in the EOPS program are required to comply with State mandates by adhering to a Mutual Responsibility Contract (MRC) for each year of participation. The MRC outlines the program's expectation of the students' participation in program services and compliance with unit load expectations.
