You MUST apply on-line at <a href="https://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>. The Board of Governors Fee Waiver (BOGFW) application can help you pay for tuition fees. To find out if you qualify, you MUST apply on-line at <a href="https://www.swccd.edu">www.swccd.edu</a>. If you have already paid for your classes and

you qualify for BOGFW, you may also qualify for a reimbursement. All students must reapply every academic year. If you need assistance applying, please stop by the Financial Aid office in Student Services.

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# **Check List for College Success**

The beginning of the semester means starting your courses on a positive note. Thus, you must be wondering if you are prepared. The following is a check list of tasks to help you succeed in college.

Assess your Math, English, and Reading skills. The assessment results will make you aware of your basic skills level. Start by taking basic skills courses, which are Math, English, and Reading. Developing these skills will make all other courses easier. For example, having good writing skills will allow you to focus on the content of a term paper rather than focusing of correct grammar. The result will be a better term paper.

#### Attend a new student orientation.

The orientation will inform you regarding registering for courses, financial aid information, student services, academic policies, graduation/transfer requirements, and other helpful tips.

Have your textbooks on the first

day of class. You can buy or rent your textbooks at SWC book stores located at the Chula Vista campus, as well as the Higher Education Centers. EOPS students can borrow books by submitting a Textbook Lending application to the EOPS office. If you need money to buy books, you might qualify for an emergency loan via the Financial Aid department. Also, check book prices at other book resources, such as chegg.com and amazon.com.

Explore your career interests by taking a self-assessment, researching your career interests, and preparing/

planning for your career choice. Exploring your career interests gives an opportunity to find that career you are truly passionate about. Realizing your career will increase motivation and help you better prepare.

**See a counselor**. A counselor will help with career exploration, personal issues, and academic planning. Be

sure to ask for your personalized Student Educational Plan (SEP). The SEP lists all the courses required to achieve your academic goal.

**Establish your goals**. Writing out your goals and how you plan to achieve them will help you realize if the goals are realistic and achievable, as well as provide a date of completion. Furthermore, determining your goals will increase your motivation to succeed in college.

Apply for financial aid. If you qualify, financial aid will help pay for courses and other college expenses. Sources of financial aid are FAFSA, BOGW, Scholarships, and if necessary

student loans.
