ESL (English as a Second Language) Classes at Southwestern College

The ESL Department primarily offers two types of classes:

Everyday English and Academic English.

EVERYDAY ENGLISH: These classes provide instruction in speaking (Oral Communication 1 & 2) and writing and reading (Written Communication 1 & 2) skills for everyday purposes. Students will learn language skills that are needed for <u>communication in his/her community</u>.

>Non-native English speakers <u>without</u> communicative language are recommended to start in Everyday English classes.

<u>ACADEMIC ENGLISH</u>: The Learning English for Academic Purposes (LEAP) program provides 4 levels of instruction in language and academic skills that are needed for <u>success in future college classes in English</u>. All of the classes in the LEAP program focus on reading, writing, vocabulary and grammar for academic purposes; you will also learn computer skills at each level. **You must take the ESL Placement Assessment in the Assessment Office to enroll in these classes.

>Non-native English speakers <u>with</u> communicative language are recommended to start in Academic English classes.
